In January we mailed the subscriptions for Issue 25, the latest issue of *Loaves & Fishes* magazine. With the recent changes in our mailing process, our singles list is down under 3,000 subscribers, so this presort mailing was a breeze. We packed the bulk subscriptions one evening with volunteers from Allegheny Valley Mennonite Church and several from our church.

I was too busy that evening to take very many pictures, but here is one with all the bulk packages containing 89,000 copies of *Loaves & Fishes*. It's a little hard to see, but there are eight large bins here, each the size of a pallet. The mail truck could only hold seven bins, but one of them was only about half full, so we were able to combine them into seven.

Later that day, the postmaster told me with a chuckle that the truck driver barely made it up the mountain to Johnstown because of all the weight! It sounds like we'll be seeing a larger truck here next time.

Including the single subscriptions and the 7,000 extra copies we printed for inventory, the entire printing took 8 pallets and weighed 10,000 pounds.
